isn't as good as last year. I was told that many of the regulars that fish Roosevelt near Spring Canyon have given it up, and are fishing the north end of Banks Lake instead

I did some checking on the Okanogan River steelhead fishing. I would have mentioned it earlier, but it appears that the fishing isn't that great. Jerrod Gibbons said that the river can be floated from Omak to Okanogan, but don't start early in the day. It takes until at least 10 a.m. for the slush and shelf ice to clear off enough for decent fishing. Even then it is pretty slow. If an angler gets one fish it counts as a good day on the Okanogan River right now.

I know it's over a month away, but don't forget to mark your calendars for the tagged trout derby that the Quincy Valley Tourism Association will put on again this year. It will be the first weekend in March. Since we are having such mild weather confidence is high that both Burke and Quincy lakes will be ice-free for fishing. Remember, there will be thousands of dollars in prize money and lots of other stuff to win at this one. I'll have more details soon. Keep an eye on my Home Page.
